Framework for Teacher Evaluation

Domains 1 and 4 represent the "behind the scenes" work of teaching: essential for accomplished practice but not visible in the classroom. This means that a teacher's skill in these domains must be demonstrated through artifacts, planning documents for Domain 1 and artifacts reflecting a

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teacher's professionalism for Domain 4.

Pennsylvania has adopted Charlotte Danielson's Framework for Teaching as the overarching vision for effective instruction in the Commonwealth. The model focuses the complex activity of teaching by defining four domains of teaching responsibility: Domains 1 and 4 cover aspects of the teaching profession that occur outside the classroom, while Domains 2 and 3 address aspects that are directly observable in classroom teaching.
