2. The cognitive neuropsychological approach. The dissociation of function, in which a patient is found to be impaired on a task assessing one cognitive process (say, written word recognition) but unimpaired on a task measuring another cognitive process (say, face recognition), has traditionally formed the backbone of the cognitive neuropsychological approach.

The study of developmental disorders garners special respect from neuropsychologists. First, it is difficult enough to try to understand the mature brain and the effects that damage to it might have, but to try to appreciate how a brain works that develops in a qualitatively different manner because of early injury is daunting (e.g., Bishop, 1997 ; Frith, 2001a).
