Jazz is a kind of music in which improvisation is typically an important part. In most jazz performances, players play solos which they make up on the spot, which requires considerable skill. There is tremendous variety in jazz, but most jazz is very rhythmic, has a forward momentum called "swing," and uses "bent" or "blue" notes. You can often hear "call--and--response"

Pre-dated by the early jazz studies programs of the 1940s, jazz guitar-specific education was formally established in 1962, when Berklee College of Music launched its guitar program. By 1977, Howard Roberts had started the Guitar Institute of Technology (GIT), which further codified electric

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guitar pedagogy, shaped both by his early guitar seminars and his many years in the studio.

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
