Look-alike/sound-alike (LASA) medications are those, either written or spoken, which may lead to potentially harmful errors when confused with each other.

Managing High-Alert/Hazardous and Look-Alike-Sound-Alike ...

Look-Alike Sound-Alike (LASA) medications include medications that are visually the same in physical appearance or packaging and names of medications that have similar spelling or similar phonetics.

Look Alike & Sound Alike Drugs

Take extra care when selecting look-alike, sound-alike (LASA) medicines with similar names, especially when stored in close proximity, e.g. allopurinol If atenolol is supplied in error to a patient with normal blood pressure, it could cause loss of consciousness, with increased risk of a fall.

Everyone in healthcare has a role in reducing medication errors.

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
