Even after her time as the king's mistress came to an end, the Madame de Pompadour remained an influential friend and advisor to the king, especially as a patron of arts and philosophy.

The Life of Madame de Pompadour, Royal Mistress and Advisor

In 1744 Louis XV's young mistress, the duchesse de Châteauroux, died suddenly. She was soon replaced by Madame d'Étioles, who obtained a legal separation from her husband and was created marquise de Pompadour. Nineteenth-century historians thought that Madame de Pompadour had complete ascendancy over Louis XV.
