Multiplying by powers of ten. Follow the following useful and easy shortcuts when multiplying by powers of ten. Whole numbers multiplied by powers of 10 When multiplying a whole number by a positive power of ten, just count how many zero(s) you have and attached that to the right of the whole number. Examples: 1) 56×10

Multiplying by Powers of Ten

Multiplying by a power of 10 is easy using just a few basic rules: 1. The number of zeroes for a power of 10 is equal to the power to which 10 is raised: $10^5 = 100,000$. 2.

And so this two will now be two hundreds. This 3710 will now be three 10s and we now have zero ones. And then if we were to multiply by 10 again, so if we were to say 2.3 times 10 to the third power, well then we're going to shift everything three places to the left. 10 to the third power. This is the same thing as multiplying by 1000.

The 'adding zeros' trick can work when multiplying whole numbers by powers of 10, for example, $678 \times 10 = 6780$, $213 \times 100 = 21300$, $34 \times 1000 = 34000$, but this method completely falls down and is totally unsuitable when multiplying a decimal value by a power of 10.

Multiplying with multiples of powers of ten has tremendous benefits in mental math. Think about long multiplication which is essentially multiplying by multiples of powers of ten. For example, 456×4 can be thought of as $4 \times 400 + 4 \times 50 + 4 \times 6$.

Multiplying Decimals' Shortcut: Whenever you multiply a decimal by a . power of 10, simply move the decimal point . to the right . the same number of places as there are .zeros. in the power of 10. In other words:-if you multiply by 10, move the decimal 1 place to the . right.-if you multiply by 100, move the decimal 2 places to ...

Introduce exponents. (The exponent of a number says how many times to use that number in multiplication, for example 4 to the third power would be $4 \times 4 \times 4$); Provide a few examples (i.e., $2^2 = 2 \times 2 = 4$, $5^2 = 5 \times 5 = 25$, $4^3 = 4 \times 4 \times 4 = 64$, and $6^3 = 6 \times 6 \times 6 = 216$). Explain that powers of ten are numbers that are a result of 10 being multiplied by itself a certain number of times.

When multiplying by a power of ten, move the decimal point to the right by as many places as there are 0s in the power of 10. For example: Let's multiply 925.653×100 . To find the product, move the decimal point to the right by as many places as there are 0s in the power of 10. $925.653 \times 100 = ?$ Notice that there are two zeros in 100.
