I. Patient Transportation

Ensure patient's property is secured and documented appropriately (assume property is contaminated). Transfer patient care and any belongings to transport team. Patient Transport — A Small Department Making a Big Impact

Non-emergency patient transport (NEPT) is for patients who require clinical monitoring or supervision during transport, but do not require a time critical ambulance response. Most NEPT transfers occur between hospitals, or between home and hospital. Some aged care patients may also be transported to and from specialist health appointments and rehabilitation.

Patient transfers should be under the direction of the person at the head of the patient. g. All catheters and tubes should be secured appropriately before and during transport.

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
