As stated by Schaetzel (2009) there are some important factors that one person must notice in the way of learning pronunciation which are accent, stress, intonation, and rhythm in the comprehensibility of the speech of nonnative speakers; the effects of motivation and exposure on the development of native-like pronunciation; and the intelligibility of speech among speakers of different English varieties.

Internal factors are those that the individual language learner brings with him or her to the particular learning situation. Age: Second language acquisition is influenced by the age of the learner. Children, who already have solid literacy skills in their own language, seem to be in the best position to acquire a new language efficiently.

The factors that influence the acquisition of a second ...

The more interaction (i.e., social/psychological closeness) a group has with the target group, the more opportunities will result for the group to acquire and use English. Conversely, less interaction (i.e., social/psychological distance) results in less acquisition and use of English.

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
