Facts are statements that are either backed up directly by evidence or where evidence can easily

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be retrieved to prove it. Opinions are statements that are based on feelings, past experiences, or emotions.

Remind students that they should be on the lookout for facts and opinions in all of their reading, listening and conversations.Â Recognizing fact and opinion is part of critical thinking.Â Focus on fact and opinion while teaching persuasive writing or working on debate.Â Strong persuasive arguments are based in fact but often strengthened with opinions.

Upper Elementary Lesson in Reading Fact and Opinion

Designate one side as "fact" and the other as "opinion." Say a statement aloud and tell students to stand on the side of the line that shows whether the statement is fact or opinion. Include some challenging statements to encourage discussion (i.e., war is always wrong; a hammer is the best tool to use when driving nails; there is too much unemployment in the United States).

Facts can be confirmed by checking books or reliable internet sources. If a fact is about a person, you can ask that person whether the fact is true. The same doesn't go for an opinion. Hold up your copy of the Facts and Opinions worksheet. Read aloud the first statement: Mystery novels are the most exciting books to read.
