In Missouri, whose program mostly supported low-income parents, the cost of uncompensated care was estimated at \$556-786 for each newly uninsured citizen. In Tennessee—where four percent of the non-elderly population lost its public insurance—the uncompensated care cost reached \$1,048-1,678.

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## **Who Bears the Cost of the Uninsured? Nonprofit Hospitals.**

In fact, most uninsured people (84.6 percent) were 19- to 64-year-olds. The two largest groups in that age range are 26- to 34-year-olds and 35- to 44-year-olds. About 1 in 4 uninsured people were 26 to 34 years old, and about 1 in 5 people ages 34 to 44. But that's not all the figure below tells us.

## **Who Are the Uninsured? - Census.gov**

Nearly half of uninsured adults may have been eligible for subsidized insurance through the marketplace or their state's expanded Medicaid program. Two-thirds (67%) of uninsured adults had not gone to the marketplace to examine their coverage options. Of those, one-third (36%) said they didn't think they could afford health insurance.

Many uninsured people avoid seeking medical care unless they are faced with an emergency or delay care until their symptoms become intolerable. As a result, uninsured people are less likely to receive a diagnosis in the early stages of a disease and more likely to suffer complications from aggravated medical conditions.

A report from a Washington, D.C.-based think tank finds that if the Affordable Care Act is overturned, Maine would see the
