Working with large production teams to scout and shoot his images, his photographs have become

increasingly complex as if it were for a motion picture production, including its painstaking preparation of elaborate sets, lighting, and cast, as seen in his seminal series *Beneath the Roses* (2003–2008) and *Twilight* (1998–2001). “My pictures are about a search for a moment—a perfect moment,” Crewdson has explained.
